On Wednesday, November 14, 2018, the Code of Evidence Oversight Committee of the Supreme Court met in the Supreme Court courtroom from 2:02 p.m. to 3:28 p.m.

Justice Mullins will ask the Chief Administrative Judges whether they have observed obstacles to authentication of business records through stipulations.

3. Thereafter, the Committee considered a proposal by Attorney John Tower regarding authentication of public records. Justice Ecker led the discussion.

After discussion, a subcommittee of Justice Ecker, Judge Morgan, and Attorney Massicotte was formed to further study the matter and report their recommendations to the Committee. The subcommittee requested advice from Professor Simon-Kerr.
