4. The Committee considered the subcommittee's revised draft of Article II—Judicial

Notice, which was presented by Attorney Steigelfest.

After discussion, the Committee unanimously voted to submit the revisions to Article II, attached hereto as Appendix B, to the Supreme Court for consideration.

- 5. The Committee considered whether Article III should be revised to include substantive provisions on the law of presumptions. After discussion, the subcommittee chaired by Judge Colin was asked to prepare such a draft for presentation at the next meeting.
- 6. The Committee considered proposals to Article IV–Relevancy, which were presented by the subcommittee comprised of Judge Jongbloed (chair) and Attorneys Carlow and Wiechmann. The Committee discussed the proposals through Sec. 4-5. The subcommittee's presentation will continue at the next meeting.
- 7. After discussion, the next meeting was scheduled for Thursday, April 28, 2016, at 2:00 p.m. in the Supreme Court courtroom.
