 Attorney Libbin provided the Committee with information regarding Winter v. Wolnitzek (May 12, 2016), a recent opinion issued by the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Kentucky wherein the Kentucky Judicial Conduct Commission was permanently enjoined from enforcing provisions in their Code of Judicial Conduct. Attorney Libbin noted that the provisions identified by the court are similar to those contained in Connecticut's Code of Judicial Conduct (i.e., Rule 2.10 (b)).
