

The Forms You Will Need to File for Divorce and to Waive the 90-Day Statutory Waiting Period

Complete These Forms

The forms listed in this supplement are the forms that you will need to file for divorce, including the form you will need if you are asking the court to waive the 90-day statutory waiting period. If you are viewing this forms supplement online, each form on the list is also a link that will take you directly to the form if you click on it. If you are obtaining this forms supplement at the courthouse, it will include paper copies of the forms.

Please read the instructions on each form. In most cases, the forms ask you to put information into the blank or box, or to check off the correct answer for your situation. The forms need to be filled out completely.

If you are representing yourself and you want to file your case electronically, or you would like electronic access to your case from outside of the courthouse after it is filed, you may request electronic access by enrolling in e-services at http://www.jud.ct.gov/external/super/E-Services/efile/ and following the instructions.

You may complete the court forms by printing the information in ink, by typing the information, or by using the fillable forms on the Judicial Branch website at www.jud.ct.gov/webforms. The forms are also available at all Judicial District clerks' offices and at the Court Service Centers.
