Minutes of the Meeting Commission on Minimum Continuing Legal Education May 4, 2023

- I. The Commission approved the minutes of the March 2, 2023 meeting.
- II. The Commission reviewed and considered a referral from the Rules Committee of the Superior Court regarding an amended request from Attorney Jonathan Weiner, chair, CBA Civics Education Committee, to amend Practice Book §2-27A(b)(7) expanding the MCLE rule permitting up to 4 hours per year of MCLE credit for judging or coaching mock trials and moot court to include "high school or undergraduate" competitions. The MCLE Commission considered the revised request and did not support a rule change to include non-law school moot court competitions. Judge Stewart, Judge Murphy and Attorney Morizio abstained from voting on this agenda item. The Commission requested that counsel prepare a letter to the Rules Committee notifying it of the Commission's position on this proposed rule change.
