PER CURIAM. The defendant, Khalid Ibrahim, appeals from the judgment of conviction, rendered after a jury trial, of felony murder in violation of General Statutes § 53a-54c and kidnapping in the first degree in violation of General Statutes § 53a-92 (a) (2) (A). The defendant’s claims are virtually identical to the claims raised in *State v. Vicente*, 62 Conn. App. 625, A.2d (2001).¹ We, therefore, dispose of the claims here in the same fashion and for the same reasons as in *State v. Vicente*, *supra*, 625.

The judgment is affirmed.
