

Changes to the Date for Filing Motions and Objections for Monday Short Calendars

Monday short calendars will be printed, posted on the Internet, and mailed two business days earlier than in the past to make sure that all counsel and self-represented parties receive timely notice. The office of the Chief Court Administrator has ordered this change because of delays in mail delivery resulting from changes in the way the US Postal Service processes mail.

The earlier printing, posting on the internet, and mailing requires a change in the date a motion or objection must be filed and entered into the system by in order to appear on a particular week's calendar.

- *Before* this change, a motion or objection could be filed and entered into the system by Friday at 5:00 p.m. and appear on the calendar that occurred two Mondays after it was filed.
- *Now*, a motion or objection must be filed and entered into the system by Wednesday at 5:00 p.m. in order to appear on the calendar that occurs two Mondays after it is filed.

This date change will ***not*** apply to any *family support magistrate* calendars or to the following civil short calendars:

- Calendar 04 for the Judicial District of Stamford/Norwalk
- Calendar 04 for the Judicial District of New Britain,
- Calendars 02 and 04 for the Judicial District of Fairfield,
- Calendars 04 and 05 for the Judicial District of New Haven;
- Calendar 04 and 05 for the Judicial District of Hartford, or
- Calendar 04 for the Judicial District of Windham at Putnam.
