To assist in fulfilling the accountability objectives of the Recovery Act, as well as the Department's responsibilities under the Government Performance and Results Act (GPRA), Public Law 103-62, applicants who receive funding under this solicitation must provide data that measure the results of their work. Data collection methods

The Connecticut Judicial Branch Office of Victim Services (OVS) will collect all required data for the 2009 Recovery Act Victim Compensation award. The OVS claims processing system will generate reports each quarter to track:

- Number of individuals who received funding under this award.
- Dollar value of claims paid under this award by type - work-loss benefits (lost wages, loss of support) or essential services (medical, dental, etc.). Costs will be identified for each specific expense type.
- Summary report indicating number of individuals who received funding by type of specific loss.
