Trial Scheduling Order

You are scheduled to come to court for a trial on the date and at the time listed above. The court will not grant any delays or continuances for this trial date, or reschedule this trial, without a compelling (important) reason.

On the day of the trial, the court also will not grant any delay for the start time of the trial, such as a recess or a continuance, to get ready for the trial or to talk about this case with an attorney if you are a self-represented defendant, or with your client if you are an attorney. You must be ready to start the trial at the time listed above.

The defendant and the defendant's attorney, if there is one in this case, **must** come to court for the trial. If you do not come to the trial on the date and at the time listed above, the court may order: (1) that your bond be forfeited (given up to the court), (2) a rearrest warrant for you, and/or (3) administrative action, for example, Motor Vehicle cases may be closed out under section 14-140 of the Connecticut General Statutes without further notice to the defendant and/or counsel.

In addition, an attorney who does not come to court on a scheduled date or causes a continuance without good cause or in any other way unnecessarily delays a case will be subject to sanctions under section 51-84 of the Connecticut General Statutes:

- (a) Attorneys admitted by the Superior Court shall be attorneys of all courts and shall be subject to the rules and orders of the courts before which they act.*
- (b) Any such court may fine an attorney for transgressing its rules and orders an amount not exceeding one hundred dollars for any offense, and may suspend or displace an attorney for just cause.*
