Instructions To Clerk

1. Attach a copy of the Victim's Designation of Receiver For Child's HIV/AIDS Test Results form JD-JM-187 and a copy of the test results to this form.
2. Forward the above documents to the recipient designated in the Victim's designation form, JD-JM-187.
3. Keep a copy of this form, the original of the Victim's Designation form, JD-JM-187, and the test results in the court file.

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Notice to Victim's Designee to Receive Child's HIV/AIDS Test Results

Connecticut General Statutes sections 54-102a and 54-102b allow the Court to order the child respondent in a sexual assault case to be tested for HIV/AIDS and the results of the test to be disclosed to the victim. Section 54-102c requires the Court to allow the victim to designate a health care provider or HIV counseling and testing site funded by the State of Connecticut Department of Public Health to receive the results of the child's court ordered HIV/AIDS test and disclose the results to the victim.

The victim in the above referenced case designated you to receive the results of the child's court ordered HIV/AIDS test. A copy of form JD-JM-187, Victim's Designation of Receiver for Child's HIV/AIDS Test Results, filed with the court is attached. Also enclosed are the results of the child's court ordered HIV/AIDS test. Please contact the victim named below to discuss when and how the victim would like to be informed of the child's HIV/AIDS test results.
