As a crime victim, you have certain rights under the constitution of Connecticut, article first, Section 8b.

You have the right to:

1. Be treated with fairness and respect throughout the criminal justice process;
2. Have the case completed in a timely manner following arrest of the accused, provided no rights of the accused are violated;
3. Be reasonably protected from the accused throughout the criminal justice process;
4. Be told of court dates;
5. Attend the trial and all other court proceedings (*arraignment, pretrial and sentencing*) unless you are testifying, in which case, the court may decide that you can't attend the trial until after you are done testifying;
6. Communicate with the prosecutor about the case;
7. Have the chance to agree or disagree with any plea agreement between the accused and the prosecutor and to make a statement to the court before the court decides if it will accept the agreement;
8. Make a statement to the court at sentencing;
9. Request restitution for expenses or property lost or damaged because of the crime; and
10. Get information about the arrest, conviction, sentence, imprisonment and release of the accused.

Nothing in this victims' rights amendment or in any law can be used as a reason for overturning a conviction or for an appeal in any criminal case.
